## **What Jesus Did Not Say**

"You know, the Good Book says that 'cleanliness is next to godliness.'" Have you ever heard anyone say something similar to this? Have they ever showed you the verse in the Bible? Of course not! Why not? Such a passage is nowhere to be found in the "Good Book!" Still though, countless misquotations and never-seen-before sayings are constantly attributed to the Bible. It is with this all too common practice in mind, that we turn our attention to a few things that Jesus DID NOT say.

First, Jesus DID NOT say, "If you love me...ABUSE my commandments." Rather than studying (2 Tim.2:15), applying (Jas. 1:22), and teaching (Mark 16:15-16) the word of God, many use the Bible only in prideful attempts to win useless and endless arguments over "foolish and unlearned questions" (2 Tim. 2:23). Such a practice is a dangerous, unskilled, and irresponsible wielding of the sword of the Spirit (Eph.6:17).

Also, Jesus DID NOT say, "If you love me...ABANDON my commandments." It could be nothing less than worldly appetites and selfish ambitions that would cause eternity-bound men and women to discard the soul-saving and death-preparing words of our Master. How foolish are we who ignore the very words which shall one day judge us (John 12:48).

And, among other things, Jesus DID NOT say, "If you love me...ALTER my commandments." Even though some of us are not so bold as to completely abandon the commands of Christ, legion are we who freely "doctor them up." This sin began long ago with the devil. Satan added just one small word to God's warning (Gen.3:4). It continues today with practices such as writing and using church manuals, disciplines, and creeds. Those who are guilty of such should diligently study passages such as Deut. 4:2, Pro. 30:6, and Rev. 22:18-19.

Although we may never hear someone say, "You know, Jesus said, 'If you love me...ABUSE, ABANDON, and ALTER my commandments,'" we do see many people who live and act as if He did say such. What Jesus DID say is this, "If you love me...KEEP my commandments" (John 14:15). May the words of our lips, and the actions of our life, say nothing differently.
