Please Get Regular Heart Checkups

We know how it is important to keep our heart healthy. Without our heart working properly, our bodies can become weak or we can even die. That is why every time we go to see our doctor, they do a check of our heart.

There came a time in David's kingship when he wanted to make the tabernacle a permanent place in the form of the temple (1 Chron 17:1). He sought the counsel of the prophet Nathan concerning this, and Nathan said to him, “Do all that is in your heart” (1 Chron. 17:2). There was only one problem – Nathan had not inquired of the Lord concerning this and it was not God's will that David build the temple (1 Chron. 17:3-14). Nathan then informed David of this (1 Chron. 17:15). David accepted it (1 Chron. 17:16-27). In fact, you could say that David had a change of heart from what he wished to what the Lord wanted.

Now, let's make an important application. There are a lot of people today who go around saying, “Just follow your heart.” The theory is that your heart will not lead you wrong. But there is an important thing to remember concerning this advice: Our hearts may or may not be right. This is a problem in religion as well as in life.

There are a lot of people who desire to worship in ways that their heart may lead them, but they have not checked to see if it is in agreement with God's heart. There are also those who believe they are saved, because they can “feel” it in their heart. Like David, it may not seem wrong since their heart tells them it is right. But if it is not in accordance with God's will, then it is not right.

Is it wrong to follow your heart? Not if it is a heart after God's own heart. That's why it is so important to have regular spiritual heart check-ups. The only way to do this is to check our heart with God's word. In David's prayer in 1 Chron. 17, he acknowledged that it was “according to God's own heart” that David not be the one to build the temple (v.19). Then at the latter part of the prayer, David stated that he found it in his heart to follow God (v.25). David set His heart after God's heart (cf. Acts 13:22).

There's the formula: Tune your heart with God – then follow your heart!
